Working to End Homelessness in Chico— The CHAT Story

Robert Trausch and Leslie Johnson will be sharing with the congregation today the story of their 12-year journey working with CHAT (Chico Housing Action Team), a wonderful nonprofit here in Chico. Since 2013, CHAT has been working hard to provide housing opportunities for people living unhoused, whether living in a homeless shelter, a car, on a couch, or camping outside in the elements. CHAT's very first project was to work with churches and other groups to provide overnight shelter during the cold winter months. First Christian was one of our first and best partners, opening its doors every year for our Safe Space winter shelter program, and enthusiastically serving delicious dinners for our guests every night. As we got to know our homeless folks better through Safe Space, we learned to our surprise that many had some income and would be thrilled to rent a bedroom in a shared home.

They just needed an opportunity! So, CHAT started renting houses and subletting the bedrooms to formerly homeless people. This model has been very successful. CHAT currently is renting to about 200 formerly homeless individuals, including veterans, seniors, people living with mental illness, college students, disabled people, and even families with children. The religious communities of Chico, including First Christian, continue to be some of CHAT's best and most faithful supporters. We look forward to telling you more about CHAT's latest projects, and we will look for you in the fellowship hall for further conversations after the service, should you have questions.
