Small Group Opportunities

- Upbeats Music Jam meets at 10:00 a.m. on Thursdays. It is open to musicians of all levels, and all are welcome.
- DWM (Disciple Women's Ministry) is a service group open to all women of the church and meets on the third Tuesday of each month from 2:00-4:00 p.m., September through May. This circle serves the church and its congregation by reaching out to homebound members at Christmas and Easter and wherever needed. The primary fundraiser is the annual bazaar (1st Saturday in November). Funds from the bazaar cover church kitchen supply expenses, and a part of the proceeds go to various outreach ministries.

- Koinonia Krafters meets on the second Tuesday of each month from 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. in the Fireside Room. Participants work on a crafting project of their choice and spend time in fellowship.

"The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases, his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness." -- Lamentations 3:22 NRSVUE

The Gospel of Luke begins the story of Jesus' birth with, "In the time of King Herod." King Herod the Great ruled from 37 BCE to 4 CE. Although Judea was occupied by Rome during this time, one of Augustus Caesar's most effective tools for maintaining control of a region was allowing local rulers to serve as client kings—so long as it was clear that Rome remained in charge.

Most scholars agree that Luke's gospel was written sometime between 75 and 100 CE, roughly 80 years after Herod's death and about 40 years after Jesus was crucified by the combined efforts of Roman and Jewish rulers. The equivalent of "In the time of King Herod and Caesar Augustus" for us might be, "In the time of Presidents Roosevelt and Truman." Although some in our congregation were alive during that time, most were children. For those of us born after 1945, that period belongs

to the generation of our parents and grandparents. We have films and newsreels from that era, but to truly understand what life was like, we rely on the stories of those who lived it.

What did "in the time of King Herod" mean to Luke's readers? For them, it evoked both peace and prosperity, and also unrest and turmoil. Herod was a savvy politician who skillfully navigated between the Jewish

people and their Roman occupiers. His greatest accomplishment was the massive renovation of the Jewish Temple—a project that required enormous material and human resources. Yet he was also notoriously cruel, executing several members of his own family, including his wife Mariamne, her mother Alexandra, and three of his sons. Augustus Caesar famously remarked, "It is better to be Herod's pig than his son." The people lived in fear of what Herod might do on a whim.

It was in this setting—during what the Apostle Paul later called "the fullness of time"—that Jesus came into the world to usher in God's reign. The world he entered was filled with uncertainty, instability, oppression, and confusion. And yet, throughout the stories of Christ's birth, the whispers of angels deliver a surprising message: "Do not fear." How is it possible to be fearless in a fearful world? When Mary, Joseph, the shepherds, and the magi are each called into God's redemptive story, they do not deny their fears—they move through them. They ask questions, hold fast to courage, trust in good news, and say, "Here I am, Lord." When we find ourselves in fearful times, can we do the same? Can we acknowledge our fears while also insisting on hope?

This year's Advent theme is "What Do You Fear: Insisting on Hope." This series looks closely at the fear and terror looming in the background of the time of King Herod and invites us to consider the fears we hold today. Fear can divide and paralyze us—or even be used as a tool to keep us quiet. But what if we formed a different relationship with fear? Can we acknowledge it without letting it rule us? Might we transform our fears into love and action? What if naming our fears helps us see more clearly how God is breaking in and where God is at work? This series gently invites us to identify where fear is present—both in the Advent story and in our lives—while also finding our way toward hope, with the angels' words still ringing in our ears: Do not be afraid.

We'll be holding our annual Candlelight Christmas Eve service with First Baptist Church in our sanctuary on December 24th. We hope you'll join us as Pastor Gail and I prepare something inspiring and meaningful for the season. As we journey through Advent together, may we choose hope—not as wishful thinking, but as a brave and steady response to fear. Come, worship with us each Sunday, light the candles of hope, peace, joy, and love, and join in our mission to bring light into the shadows of our community. Together, we can embody the good news that still breaks into fearful times: "Do not be afraid, for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all people."







Uplift Boutique—A Year in Review

In February 2025, Jenny Hildenbrand came to First Christian Church and gave a presentation on The Forgotten Initiative (helping support the foster care community and experience Jesus together). During her presentation, she expressed her dream to open a permanent resource store to provide clothing for foster care children. After working with Pastor Jesse and members of First Christian Church, a proposal was made to the church board to house the store in Room 10. The board approved the proposal, and in April of 2025, work began on preparing the resource store.

With the support of Pastor Jesse, members of First Christian Church, and other community churches, Room 10 was cleaned out, repaired, painted, and organized to become the store's location. Donated and purchased clothing racks, along with clothing donations, helped set up the space. In June 2025, the store opened to the foster care community in Butte County. The boutique operates two days a week and is staffed by volunteers from First Christian Church and other community members. Besides physical donations, monetary contributions assist in providing clothing, coats, quilts, blankets, sheets, towels, shoes, cleaning supplies, stuffed animals, and books.

This past August, the boutique held a Back to School Day, offering school clothes, backpacks, and school supplies. In September and October, cookies were taken to Butte County Social Workers in appreciation for all the work they do for foster care children and their families. In December, there will be two Christmas parties at First Christian Church for foster care families, sponsored by Butte County and ILP.

The Uplift Boutique is still working on getting more help to foster care, kinship, and reunified families in our community. We continue to work with Butte County Social Services and other family services to get the word out about the boutique.

This resource boutique could never have opened without the support of First Christian Church, Chico First Baptist Church, Bidwell Presbyterian Church, other faith churches, and community support. Along with monetary donations from the community, there have been several donations from family members in other states.

The Uplift Boutique will continue with several new ideas about what else can be done to reach out to foster families in our community. This mission brings faith, hope, and love to Butte County families in need.
