**Small Group Opportunities**

- **Blue Cloud Arts Production** Blue Cloud Art Productions is our in-house devotional creation group. We invite contributions from across our church—art, poetry, prose, and reflections that speak to your faith journey. All forms of creativity are welcome: quilts, knitting, embroidery, paintings, photography, writing—whatever is beautiful and meaningful to you.
- **Upbeats Music Jam** meets at 10:45 a.m. on Tuesdays. It is open to musicians of all levels, and all are welcome.
- **DWM (Disciple Women's Ministry)** is a service group open to all women of the church and meets on the third Tuesday of each month from

The primary fundraiser is the annual bazaar (1<sup>st</sup> Saturday in November). - **Koinonia Krafters** meets on the second Tuesday of each month from 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. in the Fireside Room. Participants work on a crafting project of their choice and spend time in fellowship.
- **Healing Circle** meets each month on the fourth Friday from 1:00 pm.-3:00 p.m. in the Bethany Room. This circle is open to all members of the church. Participants may be journeying through a chronic illness, be a caregiver, or may simply be going through a stressful period in their lives. Experiences and feelings shared in the meetings are confidential and not shared outside the group.
- **Women's Bunco Group** meets at 7:00 p.m. on the fourth Friday of each month.
- **Weekly Evening Bible Study** is offered at 6:30 p.m. on Zoom and in person in Room 6. Several 6 to 10-week sessions are offered throughout the year.

### From Pastor Jesse

As much as I encourage people to embrace change, I'm not particularly fond of it, especially when I'm content with the way things are. It was difficult for me when our Associate Minister, Katy Valentine, resigned in 2019 to pursue other ministry opportunities. Katy brought gifts and skills for ministry that were different from my own, and our church was stronger because of them. The empty space she left behind wasn't just her office. I missed her creativity, insight, and partnership in ministry.

In 2024, First Christian Church began conversations with Chico First Baptist Church about ways we might share resources and collaborate in ministry for the benefit of both congregations. I already knew Pastor Gail Hill from community connections and from the Christmas Eve candlelight services our churches had shared over the years, so there was already a sense of familiarity between our congregations.

In 2025, we decided to take a bigger step and intentionally experiment with shared ministry. We held joint events, exchanged pulpits a couple of times, and eventually worshiped together in each other's buildings. One of

the greatest blessings to come from this partnership has been our shared Bible studies. I would lead a study for several weeks at First Christian, then Gail would lead the next study at Chico First Baptist. People from both churches participated regularly and often commented on how enriching it was to learn from two different teaching styles and perspectives.

Last month, Gail announced her retirement from Chico First Baptist Church, and I found myself experiencing some of the same feelings of loss I felt when Katy resigned from our congregation. Gail and I appreciated the rhythm we had developed and the opportunity it gave each of us to occasionally have a free weeknight for rest and renewal. Gail's final Bible study on the Gospels will be on Thursday, May 28, and her final Sunday in the pulpit at Chico First Baptist Church will be June 28. A retirement reception will follow from 12:00–2:00 p.m. in the CFBC Fellowship Hall.

Because of the partnership between our churches, Gail will need to attend elsewhere after retirement in order to honor the clergy boundary guidelines of the American Baptist Churches. In other words, we don't simply "get to keep her" once she retires. Gail has said she's looking forward to

visiting many different churches and experiencing the variety of ways Christians worship together. We will certainly miss her, just as I know the congregation at Chico First Baptist will. Thankfully, the leadership at CFBC has assured me that their future intentional interim minister, and eventually their next settled pastor, intend to continue participating in shared ministries like Bible study and Faith and Films. I'm grateful that this partnership seems likely to continue growing.

Since June is already a full month and I will be away at camp for part of it, we will be taking a short break from Bible study. Our studies will resume on Thursday, July 9, both online and in person at First Christian Church. I've been asking people whether they would prefer another study on a book of the Bible or a more topical series. Most people have said they'd enjoy something challenging that explores subjects we don't often discuss in church. So I've decided to plan an eight-week study tentatively titled *The Problem with "See-yun."* As many of you know, I often talk about the difference between "sin" and "see-yun" from the pulpit, so I'll let you ponder that for now, and I'll share more details in the next issue of *The Caller*. I promise there will be plenty to think about and discuss together.

Please keep Pastor Gail and her husband, Tom, in your prayers as they conclude this season of ministry at Chico First Baptist Church. While I'm already feeling a sense of loss, I know her congregation will feel it even more deeply. If you have the opportunity, I

encourage you to let Gail know how much you appreciate her ministry and the gifts she has shared with both of our churches. My hope is that the partnership between First Christian Church and our sisters and brothers at Chico First Baptist will continue to flourish in the years ahead.

### Scams

Scams continue to be prevalent. PG&E sent out an email recently warning of them—and how to identify a scam—because they are *very good at deception*.



1. They ask for money in an unusual way—such as pre-paid debit cards, gift cards, or third-party mobile payment applications
2. They make extreme threats. For PG&E scams, they threaten to disconnect your power because of past due bills if payment is not made immediately.
3. They ask for Social Security, credit card, or account numbers, logins, and other personal information.
4. They create authentic-looking 800 numbers that appear as PG&E on your phone display. If you have doubts, hang up and call PG&E at 1-833-500-SCAM. Yes, Caller IDs can be faked.
5. If you suspect you have been the victim of fraud or feel threatened during contact with a scammer, **contact local law enforcement.**

**If anyone calls or emails, and it sounds odd, hang up and call that person or company's official number directly to confirm.**

### Missions and Outreach Corner!

#### The Chico Food Project—the Beautiful Blue Bag

The Chico Food Project is a fun and simple way to share food with the hungry in our community. We come to your doorstep 6 times per year to pick up your blue bag filled with non-perishables and leave you an empty bag for the next pickup. We are over 1,000 members strong and we collect over 11,000 lbs. of food at each pickup. The food is given to the Chico Food Locker, the Jesus Center, the Salvation Army, Vectors For Veterans, St. Vincent De Paul and CSUC Hungry Wildcats.

Currently in Butte County, one in five households are at or below poverty level. That means there are a lot of Chico families who are hungry. Seventy-five percent of single moms and their children live in poverty. Food pantries have been overwhelmed by the demand and are in desperate need of a continual supply.

Chico Food Project is a door-to-door food collection program formed to help provide non-perishable items to existing Chico food pantries six times a year.

### Uplift Boutique

In June, it will be a year since the opening of the Uplift Boutique. The Boutique has been visited by 90-100 families in need of a little extra help in raising foster children, kinship families, reunified families, and recently, any children that would benefit from a little extra help. The story of the Uplift Boutique began with a presentation by Jenny Hildebrand. She made a presentation during Moments of Mission in November 2024. Jenny is an advocate for The Forgotten Initiative, a church-based program to help foster children. Jenny's dream was to have a store where foster families could come for clothing and other supplies in raising foster children. After her presentation, First Christian Church got busy working on making her dream come true.

- April 2025: Room 10 was cleaned out, and repairs on Room 10 began.
- May 2025: Room 10 was painted, windows washed, blinds installed, and clothes racks put in place. A call went out to First Christian Church, Chico First Baptist Church, and Bidwell Presbyterian Church for donations of new and gently used clothing, quilts, blankets, sheets, and towels. Many hands worked diligently to be ready for the opening in June .

Invitations were sent out to the newspaper, social workers, local family service groups, and local churches.

Although the visitors to the boutique have been slow, the boutique has provided clothing and supplies to families in Butte, Glenn, and Tehama County.

- Members of First Christian Church and The Forgotten Initiative volunteered at Wayfinder during a Back to School Backpack giveaway.
- August 2025: The Uplift Boutique held a back-to-school day. The boutique had clothing, shoes, backpacks, and school supplies available for the families.
- September 2025: Held a Fill the Bucket Sunday (cleaning supplies for families)
- December 2025: First Christian Church provided the space for Butte County Social Services to hold a holiday party for foster children.
- The Forgotten Initiative, with the help of First Christian Church, provided snacks and gifts to foster and kinship parents during a holiday gift-giving project.
- January 2026: Boutique is now open to all children who would benefit from the boutique's many resources.
- February 2026: rented a storage unit to house cribs, highchairs, strollers, and other large items.
- March/April 2026: The boutique is expanding what is available by providing maternity clothes and clothes for teenagers.

As we move into year two of this worthwhile mission, I would like to thank Pastor Jesse, the First Christian Church board, Outreach, DWM, boutique volunteers, and the members of First Christian Church for their wholehearted support of this mission.

# How You can Help Chico Food Project

There are **3** ways to help Chico families. Fill out and mail in the attached card to:

## 1. Share Food

Ask for a beautiful blue bag. We estimate that for every 300 people who participate, we collect one ton of additional food a month. It all starts with you and our blue food bag.

## 2. Invite Your Neighbors

Ask your neighbors to get their own blue bags to fill as well.

## 3. Help Transport Food

Once every two months on the second Saturday, help pick up the bags and deliver to local food pantries. [Approximately a two-hour time commitment.]



# What Do You Do with those Beautiful Blue Bags?

There are **3** simple steps:

## 1. Shop

Each week when you go shopping, buy one non-perishable food item.

## 2. Store

Store your non-perishable food items in your food bag.

## 3. Set Out

On the second Saturday of every other month, a volunteer will pick up the bag, leave another bag in its place, and then take the filled bag to food pantries.

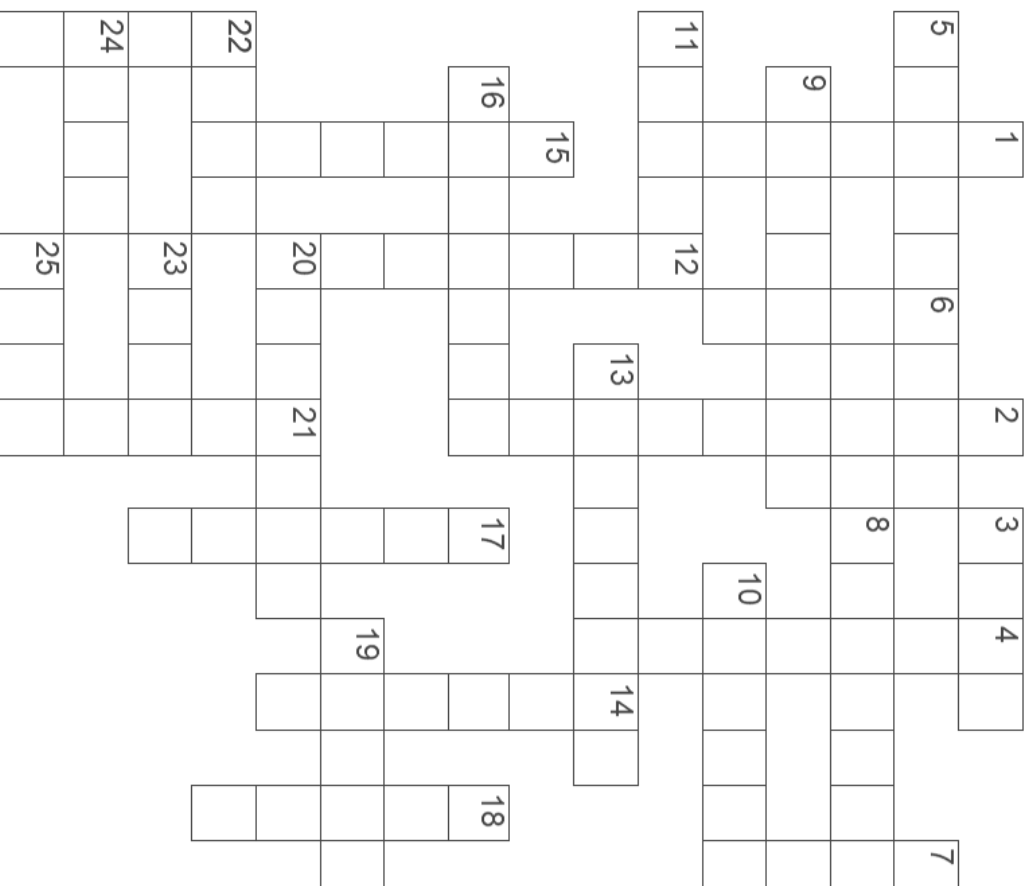
