**Small Group Opportunities**

- **Upbeats Music Jam** meets at 10:45 a.m. on Tuesdays. It is open to musicians of all levels, and all are welcome.
- **DWM (Disciple Women's Ministry)** is a service group open to all women of the church and meets on the third Tuesday of each month from 2:00-4:00 p.m., September through May. This circle serves the church and its congregation by reaching out to homebound members at Christmas and Easter and wherever needed. The primary fundraiser is the annual bazaar (1<sup>st</sup> Saturday in November). Funds from the bazaar cover church kitchen supply expenses, and a part of the proceeds go to various outreach ministries.

- **Koinonia Krafters** meets on the second Tuesday of each month from 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. in the Fireside Room. Participants work on a crafting project of their choice and spend time in fellowship.
- **Healing Circle** meets each month on the fourth Friday from 1:00 pm.-3:00 p.m. in the Bethany Room. This circle is open to all members of the church. Participants may be journeying through a chronic illness, be a caregiver, or may simply be going through a stressful period in their lives. Experiences and feelings shared in the meetings are confidential and not shared outside the group.
- **Women's Bunco Group** meets at 7:00 p.m. on the fourth Friday of each month.
- **Weekly Evening Bible Study** is offered at 6:30 p.m. on Zoom and in person in Room 6. Several 6 to 10-week sessions are offered throughout the year.
- **Sacred Grounds** is a faith-forming discussion group that meets on Sundays at 8:30 a.m.
- We offer **Sunday School** for children in 4<sup>th</sup> grade and younger. The class meets during the weekly 10:00 a.m. service.

This year, our church will be launching a three-year capital campaign called *Imagine More*. I’d like to share what that means and why it matters for the future of our ministry. Each fall, when we collect estimate-of-giving cards, those commitments help us plan our operational budget for the coming year. Your regular offerings support the daily work of our church—staff, utilities, programs, and ministries that touch lives week after week.

In addition to our regular giving, we also receive several special denominational offerings throughout the year—Easter, Pentecost, Thanksgiving, Christmas, Week of Compassion, and Reconciliation. These offerings support new congregations, higher education ministries, disaster relief, regional ministries, and important justice work in our wider church.

A capital campaign is something different. Churches launch these

campaigns to address needs that go beyond what our regular offerings can support—projects that improve our facilities and expand our ability to do ministry. Capital campaigns help a congregation imagine what’s possible when we invest in the space God has entrusted to us.

Last spring, we partnered with Disciples Church Extension Fund to begin this process. We worked

closely with Rev. Rosario Ibarra, Building and Capital Service Advisor for the west coast. Rosario visited our church, toured our facilities, helped us form a campaign committee, and guided us through identifying the most urgent needs as well as a realistic financial goal. With her support, the committee developed our theme: *Imagine More: A Vision for Everyday Ministry*. Together, we believe that over the next three years, we can raise \$250,000 to meet several important needs:

### Security

Our current alarm system covers only four rooms, and we have no video monitoring beyond our doorbell camera. Improved security—expanded alarms, additional cameras, and better exterior lighting—will help protect everyone who uses our building.

### Comfort

Our aging heating and air-conditioning systems are costly to operate. Upgrading them will make our building more efficient and provide consistent comfort, especially during hot Chico summers.

## Welcome & Aesthetics

Much of our exterior paint is decades old, and many entryways and hallways have dim lighting. Freshening these spaces will help our building reflect the warmth and hospitality of our congregation.

## Stewardship

Our grass lawn requires a significant amount of water. Transitioning to drought-resistant landscaping would reduce water use and help us care for creation more faithfully.

A campaign like this requires faith, consistency, and a shared vision for the future. Capital giving is meant to be over and above regular offerings. Many congregations find that a healthy goal is for households to consider giving approximately one-third more each year for the three years of the campaign—something that requires prayer, commitment, and trust in what God can do through us.

This effort is about more than improvements to a building. It's about strengthening our ministry for every day, for everyone, and for what's next. In the weeks ahead, you'll receive more details about the campaign, opportunities to give, and special events that will help us mark our progress.

I invite you to begin praying now for our church, for this campaign, and for the future God is imagining for us.

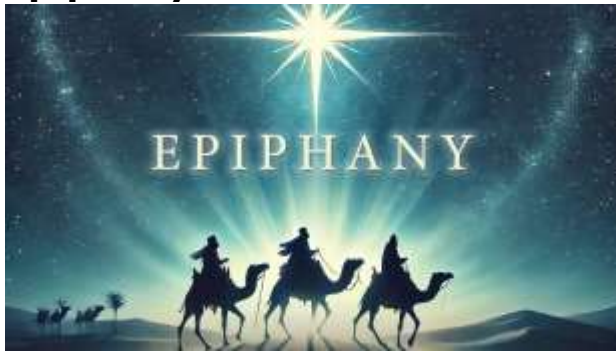
The above poem is an example of what we

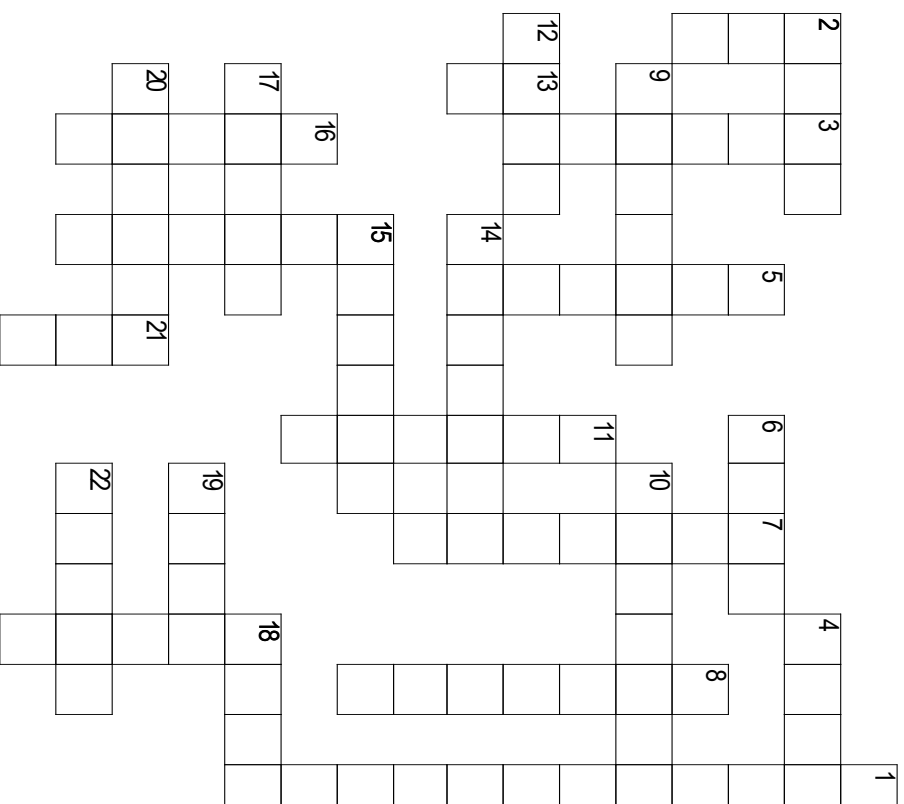
