In honor of Women's History Month



Alice Ball

Alice Augusta Ball was born in 1892 in Seattle,
Washington. She developed the first successful treatment for leprosy (Hansen's disease) in the early twentieth century. The so-called Ball Method continued

to be the best treatment until the 1940's. Ball was both the first woman and the first African American to receive a master's degree from the University of Hawaii and the first female chemistry professor at the same university. Unfortunately, Ball became ill during her research, and died in 1916 at the age of 24. The true cause of her death is unknown but may have been tuberculous or poisoning due to chlorine exposure.
